
RSA 2005 Sect 43 (11(a))

1. Time allowed:

"28 days, beginning on the date of receipt by the Commission of a new rolling stock assessment or a revised new rolling stock assessment or receipt of all information or clarifications requested (12)"



Application file Temporary Authorisation for testing Heavy Rail



RSA Section 43.

43.—(1) A railway organisation shall not bring <u>into operation</u> new rolling stock

unless—

(a) it has submitted a safety assessment (referred to in this section as a "new rolling stock assessment") to the Commission containing such information—

(i) as it considers appropriate to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the
Commission the safety of the new rolling stock, or
(ii) as the Commission may set out in <u>quidelines</u> published in accordance with section 39(4),

and

(b) the Commission has issued a communication under subsection (4).
